Maritza Zeiberg

Ms. Maritza Zeiberg is a Certified Public Accountant and the Director of the Division of Program Integrity in the Office of Management Assessment at NIH. She has worked at HHS for 27 years and spent the last 21 at NIH managing a diverse organization of analysts, auditors, and Certified Public Accounting firms that conduct complex reviews of allegations of fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanagement of grant and contract programs, and assess internal controls related to these programs. She is responsible for managing a diverse portfolio of reviews of non-criminal allegations related to NIH programs. She also serves as the NIH liaison for the OIG Office of Investigations, the Department of Justice, and other law enforcement organizations. With her high-performing staff, she has managed over 1,000 reviews and made recommendations that have saved the U.S. Government over \$40 million dollars and put over \$500 million to better use.

Les Hollie

Mr. Hollie is an Assistant Inspector General for Investigations (AIGI) within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Office of Inspector General (OIG), Office of Investigations (OI). As the AIGI, Mr. Hollie is the senior executive responsible for supervising the activities of Special Agents in Charge as assigned. This includes over 600 professional staff to include Philadelphia, Boston, New York, Chicago Offices and Administrative Operations Branch, and Special Investigations Branch Offices in Washington, D.C. Under his leadership, the Office of Investigations had record accomplishments to include over \$5 billion in investigative receivables. Mr. Hollie earned his Bachelor's Degree at Indiana University-Purdue University.
